

#### Peter Cox: History of Lefroy

Lefroy, a small hamlet some 15 kilometres from George Town was once the scene of Tasmania's second biggest goldfield and its fourth largest town. When at its peak it even eclipsed Beaconsfield in production. However the story of this town has not been told. Peter became interested in the place two years ago when he decided to write a small brochure on its history - something he planned to do in a week. However the story of the town and its mines is so full of mysteries that he can only give a progress report rather than a completed work

Peter graduated with honours in history from the University of Tasmania. After graduation he taught History, Geography and Social Science in Tasmanian schools. Since his retirement he has devoted his time to researching Tasmanian history and promoting George Town, where he lives. Peter is currently a member of both the Launceston Historical Society and the George Town and District Historical Society.
